KERWIN GALLERIES

Located in the mid-peninsula town of Burlingame, Kerwin Galleries has been providing high quality original art to Bay Area patrons for over 50 years. Mercedes and Richard Kerwin opened the gallery in 1961 primarily as a print and frame shop, but quickly expanded their focus as they began to display paintings by local artists, original prints, and vintage California paintings. Today the gallery has garnered a reputation as a primary source of fine art to collectors, design professionals and individuals who wish to enhance the beauty of their living space.

Visitors who enter the gallery are welcomed with an eclectic mix of art hung in French salon style, with paintings displayed from floor to ceiling. The abundance of inventory overflows into orderly stacks and bins creating an air of discovery as one is encouraged to pore through them to find just the piece to their liking. Relaxed and informal is the watchword here.

Although Kerwin Galleries is best known for its selection of historic California art and work by California Impressionists such as William H. Clapp, Carl Sammons and John A. Dominique, they also possess one of the country's largest collections of color etchings by Josef Eidenberger and the Kasimir family of Austria. These intricately detailed renderings of European and American architectural subjects are striking examples of this nearly lost art.

Contemporary artists are represented as well. Bold, richly colored renditions of the Bay Area urban areas by Jerrold Turner, sensitive floral and fashion illustrations by Nancy Martin and realistic interpretations of the California coastal areas and hills by Robert Wee and William Hamilton may all be found here. Other offerings include contemporary graphics, bronze sculpture and an extensive collection of American art books.

Currently on exhibit are the paintings of Donald Maier and Bela Bodo, two artists who recently passed away. In Maier's work, familiar Bay Area and Southwest localities are captured in quickly executed strokes of pastel or watercolor, creating convincing scenes with an economy of means. By contrast, Bela Bodo's paintings evoke an earlier time in their impressionistic views of the California landscape replete with ebullient flower fields and blooming orchards. The exhibit will run through May 30th.

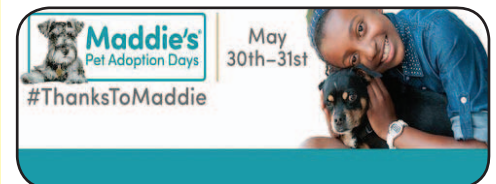
